1. POLICY:

Registered Nurses and Nurse Practitioners shall handle, dispense and administer suboxone according to the FNIHB policy found in the *FNIHB Nursing Station Formulary and Drug Classification System*.

2. PRINCIPLES:

- 2.1 Suboxone is indicated for substitution treatment in opioid drug dependence in adults.
- 2.2 In regions with a community-based Opioid Addiction Treatment Program approved by Regional Office Senior Management, a small quantity of Suboxone tablets may be kept on hand at the nursing station as bulk inventory for emergency situations only.
- 2.3 Clients undergoing Suboxone treatment must be involved in ongoing monitoring, counseling and screening.

3. DEFINITIONS:

Nurse: Refers to Registered Nurses and Nurse Practitioners.

4. PROCEDURE:

- 4.1 The nurse shall verify the written order in accordance with the FNIHB-OR *Pharmacy Administration Standards* policy.
- 4.2 Suboxone shall be handled as directed by the FNIHB (2013). *FNIHB Nursing Station Formulary and Drug Classification System*.
- 4.3 In communities whereby suboxone is being stocked, the NIC shall ensure that sufficient naloxone (poisoning antidote) is stocked in the health facility as outlined in the *FNIHB Nursing Station Formulary and Drug Classification System*.

NOTE: In communities where there are no approved Suboxone community-based Opioid Addiction Treatment Programs in place, nursing stations will not stock Suboxone as a bulk inventory.

4.4 The nurse shall seek clarification from his/her supervisor or regional pharmacist, as required.
