2.2.6. > Labelled Specimens / No Requisition:

The laboratory will contact the physician, if the physician can be identified, to inform him/her that labelled specimens have been received but without an accompanying requisition. The laboratory may, in consultation with the physician, develop a requisition and proceed with testing. Reports will be issued and the laboratory will forward the requisition to the physician for signature. If the physician cannot be identified, the specimen will generally be rejected.

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2.3. Other Conditions for Specimen Rejection:

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The following specimens are automatically rejected and recollection is required.

- > Specimens of inadequate volume collected in anticoagulant and those specimens of inadequate volume for proper testing.
- > Specimens stored improperly; for example, allowed to remain at room temperature for extended periods of time.
- > Specimens not properly mixed with preservative; for example, stool for culture.
- > Grossly hemolyzed, lipemic or icteric specimens
- > Excessive delay in transport of specimen
- Leaking/contaminated specimens
- > Unsuitable specimen for type of request.
- > Contaminated specimen; for example, sputum contaminated with saliva, urine contaminated with stool.
- > Improper patient preparation.
- Urine specimens greater than two (2) hours old.
