COVID-19 in Ontario

- COVID-19 continues to circulate in Ontario with increased cases being reported, including cases identified as variants of concern (VOC)
- Toronto, Peel and North Bay-Parry Sound Public Health Regions Returned to Strengthened COVID-19 Response Framework
 - A revised COVID-19 Response Framework has been provided to outline restrictions
- The Janssen Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 vaccine was authorised 05 Mar 2021 for those 18 years of age and older
 - It is a <u>viral vector-based</u> vaccine
 - There are now four COVID-19 vaccines authorised in Canada

Public health measures like watching your distance, washing your hands, and wearing a mask remain very important even as we see increased vaccination

- Avoid crowded places, close contact, and closed spaces
- Avoid gathering, and keep 2 m distance from those not in your household
- Wear a <u>face covering</u> (cloth mask, non-medical mask) when running essential errands
- Stay home and self-isolate if you are sick, feel unwell, or have symptoms of COVID-19

COVID-19 FNIHB-OR Epi Report

- As of March 8th, 2021 at 4:00 pm we have 1,117 First Nations confirmed cases that is 110 more cases than last week. We currently have 154 active cases in 25 communities.
- Since the beginning of the pandemic, there have been 8 deaths. Two deaths occurred in the first wave and six occurred recently.
- In total, 17,508 tests have been reported to FNIHB-OR.
- A grand total of 43,293 tests (including tests done in SLFNHA and WAHA areas).
- As of March 8th, 2021, Ontario reported an increase of 1,631 cases of COVID-19. The number of hospitalizations decreased to 626. The number of patients in ICU is relatively the same from 280 to 282. The number of patients on a ventilator increased slightly from last week from 175 to 184. Ontario region has 13 active cases that are hospitalized and 5 cases are in ICU.
- As of March 8th, 2021, an estimated 912,486 COVID vaccine doses have been administered in Ontario. Daily doses administered is 21,882. Over 273,676 people are fully vaccinated.
- 75 out of 116 (65%) communities reported holding influenza immunization clinics. A total of 7,712 Influenza vaccines have been administered (11.2% coverage rate within reporting communities). Last Flu season we had a 9.1% coverage rate within reporting communities.
- To date, no influenza cases have been reported to FNIHB this flu season. Flu Watch reports that Influenza testing continues at seasonal levels. To date, there is no evidence of community circulation of influenza. (Flu Watch, Week 8)

CD Unit Activities

COVID Vaccine:

- As Dr. Freeman mentioned, the Janssen vaccine has been approved for use in Canada on March 5, 2021 for individuals 18 years of age and older.
 - We will await Ministry guidance for the use of the vaccine.
 - o It is a single 0.5ml dose
 - o Side effects include pain at the site of injection, body chills, feeling tired and feeling feverish
