COVID-19 in Ontario

- COVID-19 continues to circulate in Ontario with increased cases being reported, including cases identified as variants of concern (VOC) of the virus
- Ontario remains in <u>shutdown</u> and on 12 Jan 2021 Ontario declared a second <u>Provincial State of Emergency</u> with additional restrictions and measures including a stay at home order
- On 29 Jan 2021 the province announced <u>additional measures</u> including testing international travelers, sequencing, and case and contact management

Public health measures like watching your distance, washing your hands, and wearing a mask remain very important

- Avoid crowded places, close contact, and closed spaces
- Avoid gathering, and keep 2 m distance from those not in your household
- Wear a face covering (cloth mask, non-medical mask) when running essential errands
- Stay home and self-isolate if you are sick, feel unwell, or <u>have symptoms</u> of COVID-19

COVID-19 FNIHB-OR Epi Report

- As of February 1st, 2021 at 4:00 pm we have 549 First Nations confirmed cases that is 61 more cases than last week. We currently have 83 active cases in 18 communities. Five communities have active cases over 9.
- Since the beginning of the pandemic, there have been 3 deaths. Two deaths occurred in the first wave and one occurred recently.
- In total, 12,549 tests have been reported to FNIHB-OR.
- A grand total of 34,350 tests (including tests done in SLFNHA and WAHA areas).
- As of February 1st, 2021, Ontario reported an increase of 1,969 cases of COVID-19. The number of hospitalizations decreased to 1,158. Less patients are in the ICU from 397 to 354 and less patients are on a ventilator from 283 to 260.
- As of February 1st, 2021, 344,546 COVID-19 vaccine doses have been administered in Ontario. That is 2.3% of the population.
- 75 out of 116 (65%) communities reported holding influenza immunization clinics. A total of 7,513 Influenza vaccines have been administered (10.9% coverage rate within reporting communities). Last Flu season we had a 9.1% coverage rate within reporting communities.
- To date, no influenza cases have been reported to FNIHB this flu season.
