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#### **COVID-19 in Ontario**

- COVID-19 continues to circulate in Ontario with increased cases being reported
- On 25 Nov 2020 the province issued a statement on <u>celebrating more safely</u> during the holiday season, requesting people gather in person only with members of their own household
- On 27 Nov 2020 the province announced <u>moving a number of regions</u> into more restrictive levels effective 30 Nov 2020
  - The most updated <u>COVID-19 Response Framework</u> has information on the requirements of each level, and the categorisation of the regions

# Public health measures like watching your distance, washing your hands, and wearing a face covering remain very important

- Avoid crowded places, close contact, and closed spaces
- Avoid gathering, and keep 2 m distance from those not in your household
- Wear a face covering (cloth mask, non-medical mask) when running essential errands where you'll be indoors
- Stay home and self-isolate if you are sick, feel unwell, or <a href="https://have.symptoms">have symptoms</a> of COVID-19
- A free <u>app</u> is available to inform users if they may have been exposed to the COVID-19 virus you can <u>learn more</u> <u>here</u>

#### **Guidance Documents**

The Ministry website was last updated 25 November 2020

- Gatherings, Ethno-cultural and Festive Occasions and Other Events V3.0 (25 Nov 2020)
  - This guidance may change based on monitored indicators for COVID-19 epidemiology
  - General advice for all people living in Ontario is to limit close contact to those people in your own household, that is those you live with
  - o Additional measures are outline for Red and Grey Zones

The Government of Canada also provided <u>advice around holiday celebrations</u>, dated 23 November 2020, the first step of which is to follow local public heath advice in total of 7 sections that are discussed:

- Follow advice from your local public health authority
  - Follow local guide for gathering size limits
  - Event cancellations due to region specific mandates
- When to stay home and away from others
  - Diagnosed with COVID-10 or awaiting lab results
  - Been in close contact with someone who has/suspected to have COVID-19
  - o Are in quarantine or isolation
  - Feeling sick or having any symptoms of COVID-19
  - o Recently returned from travel outside of Canada within the past 14 days
  - Recently returned from travel inside Canada to a province/territory that has quarantine requirements
- Think about the risks
  - Lower-risk
  - Higher-risk
  - People at risk of more sever disease (Immunocompromised, older adults and young children)
  - Substance use
- Safety precautions at gatherings
  - Before and after gatherings
  - Hosting

- Holiday travel
  - o Car
  - o Public Transit
  - o Rideshare, taxi or limo services
  - o Air travel
- Shopping during the holidays
  - o Plan ahead
  - Follow standard precautions
  - Limit the number of people shopping with you
- Mental health during the holidays
  - Take care of yourself and reach out if you need help
  - o If you live alone, consider spending it with another household
  - Limit use of substances

## **COVID-19 FNIHB-OR Epi Report**

- As of December 1st, 2020, we have 192 First Nations confirmed cases and 7 non-First Nations confirmed cases. We currently have 12 active cases in 6 communities.
- Since the beginning of the pandemic, there have been 2 deaths. The two deaths occurred in the first wave.
- In total, 8,122 tests have been reported to FNIHB-OR.
- A grand total of 27,420 tests (including tests done in SLFNHA and WAHA areas).
- On November 30<sup>th</sup>, the Health Units with the largest numbers are: Toronto 622, Peel 390, York Region 217 and Durham with 108.
- 11 other health units are reporting double digit increases such as Waterloo Region, Hamilton, Windsor, Halton Region, Ottawa, Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph, Simcoe Muskoka, Niagara, Thunder Bay, Eastern Ontario and Middlesex-London.
- 73 out of 116 (63%) communities reported holding immunization clinics. A total of 6,312 Influenza vaccines have been administered (9.2% coverage rate within reporting communities)

# CD Unit: Survey for COVID-19 Public Health Response within Communities

- CD Team has developed a quick <u>survey</u> to collect information on the current status of COVID-19 public health response within communities.
  - The survey questions include areas of need for education, support or resources for community preparedness and response to COVID-19.
  - o Information gathered from the survey will help the CD Unit identify areas for development and delivery of education, tools or resources.
