COVID-19 in Ontario

- COVID-19 continues to circulate in Ontario with increased cases being reported
 - o All of the province is in <u>Stage 3</u> of reopening, but on 08 Sep the province announced a "pause" of 4 weeks on further reopening
- Across the province <u>lower limits on unsupervised gatherings</u> like parties, dinners, gatherings, BBQs, or wedding receptions held in private residences, backyards, parks and other recreational areas, are now in place
 - o 10 people at an indoor event or gathering (previous limit of 50); or
 - o 25 people at an outdoor event or gathering (previous limit of 100)
- Additional measures and restrictions to restaurants, bars, and other food and drink establishments (including nightclubs)
 - o Prohibition of the sale of alcohol after 11 p.m. and the consumption of alcohol after 12:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. (including employees);
 - o Requirement to close by 12:00 a.m. and remain closed until 5:00 a.m. except for takeout or delivery;
- Closure of all strip clubs across the province
- Requirement for businesses/ organisations to comply with any advice, recommendation, and instructions issued by the Office of the Chief Medical Officer of Health on screening for COVID-19

Public health measures like watching your distance, washing your hands, and wearing a face covering remain very important

- Avoid crowded places, close contact, and closed spaces
- Avoid gathering, and keep 2 m distance from those not in your social circle
- Wear a <u>face covering</u> (cloth mask, non-medical mask) when running essential errands where you'll be indoors
- Stay home and self-isolate if you are sick, feel unwell, or have symptoms of COVID-19
- A free <u>app</u> is available to inform users if they may have been exposed to the COVID-19 virus you can learn more here

COVID-19 FNIHB-OR Epi Report

- As of September 29th, 2020, we have 70 First Nations confirmed cases and 7 non-First Nations. The
 new cases in September were reported from 5 northern communities. We currently have 12 active
 cases.
- Since the beginning of the pandemic, there have been 2 deaths.
- In total, 6,205 tests have been reported to FNIHB-OR.
- A grand total of 15,830 tests (including tests done in SLFNHA and WAHA areas).
- The province reported 700 cases of coronavirus on Monday September 28th, 2020, the most on a single day since the outbreak began in late January. Monday's count of new cases surpasses the previous high of 640, which came on April 24, when community transmission of the virus was thought to be at its peak in the province.
- As of September 28th, 2020 the majority of newly confirmed cases were concentrated in four public health units: 344 in Toronto, 104 in Peel, 89 in Ottawa and 56 in York Region. Other health units reporting double-digit increases were Niagara Region-20 cases, Halton Region—15 cases, Hamilton—13 cases and Simcoe Muskoka—12 cases.

 - o Inclusion of information related to testing and serological detection of SARS-CoV-2 antibodies
 - Update to the atypical signs & symptoms of COVID-19
