COVID-19 in Ontario

- The provincial state of emergency has ended, but legislation is in place to support the response to COVID-19
- All of the province is in Stage 3 of reopening
- A free app is available to inform users if they may have been exposed to the COVID-19 virus you can learn more here

Public health measures like watching your distance, washing your hands, and wearing a face covering remain very important

- Avoid crowded places, close contact, and closed spaces
- Opening your 'social circle' to up to 10 people may be considered these are people you can have close contact with keep 2
 m from those not in your social circle
- Wear a <u>face covering</u> (cloth mask, non-medical mask) when running essential errands where you'll be indoors some areas of
 Ontario require you to wear a face covering find more information about how masks help <u>here</u> and <u>here</u>
- Stay home and self-isolate if you are sick, feel unwell, or have symptoms of COVID-19

Guidance Documents

The Ministry website was last updated 17 August 2020

- COVID-19 Provincial Testing Guidance Update V7.1 (14 August 2020)
 - o Addition of indications for serology (very limited) serology should NOT be used for screening or diagnosis of acute COVID-19 infection
 - o Updated information on asymptomatic testing and targeted testing campaigns
 - o Addition of schools to priority populations for testing

COVID-19 FNIHB-OR Epi report

- As of August 17th, 2020, we have 64 confirmed cases. Of those cases, 62 or 97% have resolved. We currently have no active cases.
- Since the beginning of the pandemic, there have been 2 deaths.
- In total, 4,556 tests have been reported to FNIHB-OR. 861 tests (19%) are pending and 3,631 tests (80%) are negative.
- A grand total of 8,656 tests (including 2,576 tests from SLFNHA and 1,524 tests from WAHA).
