COVID-19 in Ontario

- The provincial state of emergency has ended, but new legislation is in place to support the response to COVID-19
- Most of the province is in <u>Stage 3</u> of reopening with the <u>exception of Windsor-Essex</u> County Health Unit which will
 move to Stage 3 tomorrow, 12 August 2020
- A free <u>app</u> is available to inform users if they may have been exposed to the COVID-19 virus you can <u>learn more</u> here

Public health measures like watching your distance, washing your hands, and wearing a face covering remain very important

- Avoid crowded places, close contact, and closed spaces
- Opening your 'social circle' to up to 10 people may be considered these are people you can have close contact with keep 2 m from those not in your social circle
- Wear a <u>face covering</u> (cloth mask, non-medical mask) when running essential errands where you'll be indoors some areas of Ontario require you to wear a face covering find more information about how masks help <u>here</u> and here
- Stay home and self-isolate if you are sick, feel unwell, or have symptoms that could be COVID-19

Guidance Documents

The Ministry website was last updated 07 August 2020

- The Case Definition was updated 06 August 2020 to include information on serology testing
- COVID-19 Provincial Testing Guidance Update V7.0 (06 August 2020)
 - o Includes new information on serology testing and updated guidance on testing asymptomatic people and targeted asymptomatic testing campaigns
- COVID-19 Reference Document for Symptoms V6.0 (06 August 2020)
 - o Updates the section on multisystem inflammatory syndrome in children (MIS-C) including links to the WHO and CPSP case definitions
- Appendix 8: Cases with Positive COVID-19: Serology Results and Management of Cases with Multisystem Inflammatory Syndrome in Children (MIS-C) Temporally Associated with COVID-19
 - o This is a new document to support the public health management of serology testing and MIS-C
 - o For more information on serology testing, please see the Public Health Ontario Laboratory (PHOL) website
 - o <u>Serology use is very limited</u> in Ontario and at this time may only be indicated for investigation of suspected cases of MIS-C or with advance PHO microbiologist approval, for those with severe illness who have tested repeatedly negative by PCR, and where serology results would be a helpful adjunctive tool for clinical/public health action and decision making
- <u>Schools</u> in Ontario will reopen in September for in-person classes; the province has provided further guidance on how this will happen for elementary and secondary schools

COVID-19 FNIHB-OR Epi report

- As of August 10th, 2020, we have 64 confirmed cases. Of those cases, 61 or 95% have resolved. We currently have one active case.
- Since the beginning of the pandemic, there have been 2 deaths.
- In total, 4,240 tests have been reported to FNIHB-OR. 853 tests (20%) are pending and 3,323 tests (78%) are negative.
- A grand total of 7,847 tests (including 2,302 tests from SLFNHA and 1,305 tests from WAHA).

Environmental Public Health Officers (EPHO)

- Environmental Public Health Officers continue to work remotely with communities but can provide in-person inspections, on request
- Currently, some community daycares and schools are preparing to open and have asked for EPHO support in the planning process

FNIHB CD Unit Activities

CD Unit: COVID -19 Recommended Public Health Follow Up v2 (8 AUG 2020)

- A tool developed to assist with the review of public health case and contact management as per the <u>Public</u> Health Management of Cases and Contacts of COVID-19 in Ontario v8
- This resource also highlights contact tracing, risk levels and recommendations
- The revisions reflect recent changes to the provincial documents
- Highlights of the changes include:
 - o Removal of medium-risk level: includes low-risk and high-risk level of exposure only
 - New label "re-positive": Cases that have tested positive for COVID-19 after being cleared from a previous positive result are identified as 're-positive'
 - o Testing and re-testing recommendations and considerations
 - *The revised document will be posted on Onehealth > Public Health Unit > Communicable Disease Unit > COVID-19
