COVID-19 in Ontario

- Emergency orders are renewed to at least 29 July 2020
- The provincial <u>state of emergency</u> has ended, but <u>new legislation</u>, the *Reopening Ontario (A Flexible Response to COVID-19) Act*, is in place to support the orders, and facilitate restrictions moving forward
- Most of the province moved to <u>Stage 3</u> on Friday 17 July, and <u>seven additional regions moved to Stage 3</u> Friday 24 July
 - Most businesses, public spaces, and services are able to <u>reopen</u> in areas in Stage 3 with some exceptions
 - The following will not yet reopen: amusement parks, water parks, overnight stay camps, dancing at restaurants, karaoke, prolonged contact sports, and buffet style food services
 - o Gatherings of up to 50 people inside and 100 people outside are possible in Stage 3 with physical distancing and public health measures in place
 - Religious services, weddings, and funerals will remain at 30% capacity of the venue
 - o The following three regions will remain in Stage 2, with the date to move to Stage 3 still to be determined: Peel Public Health; Toronto Public Health; and Windsor-Essex County Health Unit.

It is still advised to avoid crowded places, close contact, and closed spaces even as the province reopens

Public health measures like physical distancing, hand hygiene, wearing a face covering, and respiratory etiquette remain very important

Avoid crowded places, close contact, and closed spaces as much as possible

- Stay home except for essential errands and outdoor exercise, and stay 2 metres from other people when you go
 out
 - o Opening your 'social circle' to up to 10 people may be considered these are people you can have close contact with
- Wear a <u>face covering</u> (cloth mask, non-medical mask) when running essential errands where you'll be indoors some areas of Ontario require you to wear a face covering find more information about how masks help <u>here</u> and here
- Stay home and self-isolate if you are sick, feel unwell, or have symptoms that could be COVID-19

- <u>Reopening Retirement Homes</u> (updated 22 July 2020)
 - o Describes the timeline, activities, and requirements for the gradual reopening of retirement homes
 - o Outlines requirements to support visitors and absences of residents (to support residents leaving to shop, visit, attend appointments)
- <u>Update to Visits at Long-Term Care Homes</u> outlines how to support continued gradual resumption of visitors to LTC from 10 June 2020 direction
 - o Effective 15 July 2020 outdoor visits may occur with two visitors at one time, following restrictions and guidance
 - o Effective 22 July 2020 indoor visits may occur with two visitors at one time, following restrictions and guidance

COVID-19 FNIHB-OR Epi report

- As of July 27th, 2020, we have 63 confirmed cases. Of those cases, 59 or 94% have resolved. We currently have two active cases.
- Since the beginning of the pandemic, there have been 2 deaths.
- In total, 3,797 tests have been reported to FNIHB-OR. 697 tests (18%) are pending and 3,037 tests (80%) are negative.
- A grand total of 6,445 tests (including 1,571 tests from SLFNHA and 1,077 tests from WAHA).

FNIHB CD Unit Activities

- COVID-19 Point of Care Risk Assessment (PCRA)
 - The PCRA resource is specific to COVID-19
 - o Highlights the assessing the risk of exposure to COVID-19 and other infectious diseases when interacting with a given patient in a given situation
 - Choosing the appropriate IPAC actions to minimize the risk of exposure and transmission, including routine practices and additional precautions
- Environmental Cleaning & Disinfecting for Ambulatory Settings During COVID-19 v2
 - Version 2 has been released, updating the original sent out in June
 - This document is to serve as a reference sheet for Environmental Services workers and allied staff to use as a quick guidance
 - Changes include additions to the:
 - Waste Management Section:
 - If a bag is punctured, or has waste spilled on the exterior, place it into a second biohazard bag
 - Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for Environmental Cleaning related to COVID-19
 - Cleaning an empty room after a patient with suspected or confirmed of COVID-19
