COVID-19 in Ontario

- Renewal of the provincial state of emergency to at least 12 May 2020; public schools closed until at least 31 May 2020
- Importance of continuation of measures to prevent spread through physical (previously called social) distancing
 - Stay home if you are not an essential worker
 - Stay home except for essential errands like to a medical appointment or for groceries/medication (and minimise these trips)
 - Stay 2 metres from other people if you have to go out
- Importance of self-isolation if unwell, and self-quarantine (also often called self-isolation) if there was a potential exposure
 - Closure of a community, or restriction of entry is not sufficient to prevent spread as people (like essential workers) may still be going in and out – also need physical distancing and other measures
- Continued importance of hand hygiene, respiratory etiquette, and appropriate cleaning and disinfection of surfaces

COVID-19 Epi report

- As of May 5th, 2020, we have 38 confirmed cases. Of these cases 21 or 55% have resolved.
- Since the beginning of the pandemic, there has been 1 death in an elder.
- In total, 784 tests have been reported to FNIHB-OR. 169 tests (22%) are pending and 577 tests (74%) are negative.

Immunization Services During COVID-19 Response

- In follow up to last week's Memo, Immunization Services during COVID-19 Response, health
 facilities are encouraged to evaluate the appropriateness to consider reinstating priority
 vaccinations within their facilities. Such priorities include: routine infant immunizations (2 to 15
 month vaccinations as per the PFISFO, high-risk and special populations, tetanus booster for
 those injured or wounded and vaccinations for health care workers)
