## SUBJECT -Labelling Requirements When Dispensing Medications to Clients

Please be reminded of the legal and/or pertinent information that must be on a label when dispensing any medication to a client. The following information must be on the label:

- 1) Name, address, telephone number of location from which drug is dispensed;
- 2) The client's name;
- 3) The medication name and strength, name of manufacturer, and drug identification number (DIN)
- 4) Directions for use;
- 5) Quantity dispensed;
- 6) The name and designation of prescriber;
- 7) The name of the dispenser;
- 8) The date that drug is dispensed;
- 9) Expiration date when applicable (e.g. for topical cream/ointment, eye drops/ointment, oral liquid medication like antibiotic suspension).

**Note:** Do not put expiration date on the label for oral tablets or capsules

10) Auxiliary labels (e.g., shake well) are affixed in addition to the label when necessary.

Once the label is completed, two (2) copies of the label should be printed out:

- 1 label goes onto the container which is dispensed to the client; and
- 1 label goes into the client's chart

Please post this memorandum near the label machine in the nursing stations to be used as a quick reference when nurses dispense medications to clients.
