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Course Outline

Mental Health Emergencies: Using Pre-Printed Order Sets

Course Description

This 36 minute narrated webinar covers an overview of the Pre-Printed Order for pharmacological treatment of Mental Health Emergencies. It is intended for all nursing station nurses who provide direct client care in remote or isolated Indigenous communities.

Prerequisites

Nurses must review FNHA suicide prevention and intervention adult care clinical practice guideline and be familiar with basic mental health nursing assessments and interventions (e.g. de-escalation)

Training/Learning Outcomes

After completion of this course, participants will be able to:

- Practice mental health nursing with client-centred and evidence-informed care
- Explain the definition of Mental Health Emergencies
- Describe the basics of a Pre Printed Order
- Explain Mental Health Emergencies treatment goals
- Reference treatment algorithm to determine recommended treatment based on risk assessment
- Standardize pharmacological treatment of Mental Health Emergencies at nursing stations
- List the nursing station formulary medications to be used for treatment
- Apply PPO into practice by review of case exercises in facilitated sessions
