Basic Safety Training (BST)

Course Description

This 1.5 to 2-hour course provides basic and necessary information to new employees about their safety in the workplace. It also ensures that FNHA is compliant with the BC Occupational Health and Regulation parts 3.22 to 3.25 **Young or New Workers** regulation for low-risk worksites.

Prerequisites

There is no prerequisite for this course.

Training/Learning Outcomes

After completion of this course, the participants will be able to:

- Compare and locate the Workers Compensation Act and OH&S Regulations
- Interpret the organization's governance drivers and safety policies
- Identify the risks posed by the top five types of injuries in health care
- Describe and summarize the difference between Workplace Violence/Aggression and Workplace Bullying and Harassment
- List fleet vehicle use requirements and describe distracted driving hazards
- Explain the importance of hazard recognition and regular workplace inspections
- Identify what incidents to report, how to report and follow-up
- Identify and list needed further safety training
